Please note:

1. Nominal hours are not hours of training or instruction. They are used to determine course fees and subsidy levels to reflect the cost to deliver quality training.
2. Concession and annual course fee caps may also apply to some courses. Fee caps apply to some tuition fees only. Note: Proof of eligibility for concession must be demonstrated prior to the commencement of the unit. If the concession is valid for the full enrolment period, then all eligible units commenced within that period attract the concession rate. If the concession is valid for part of the enrolment period, then only eligible units commenced prior to the expiry of the concession attract the concession rate.
3. The maximum course fee for non-concession students undertaking a targeted fee relief course in 2025 is \$1,200 (excluding resource fees)
4. For concession students and youth (under 25), the maximum course fee for undertaking a targeted fee relief course in 2025 is \$400 (excluding resource fees)
These maximums apply per course in 2025.
5. Fee caps for secondary school-aged persons not enrolled at school
6. For secondary school-aged persons not enrolled at school, the maximum course fee chargeable in 2025 is \$420. (Excluding resource fees)
7. Students can only be enrolled into one subsidised course at a time.



Who can access subsidised training in WA?

The WA State Government, through Jobs and Skills WA, subsidises vocational education and training (VET) courses in priority areas, to reduce or remove the fees and make training more accessible to all Western Australians.

To be eligible for free training, reduced-fee qualifications or a subsidised training place; you must have left school, have your primary place of residence in Western Australia, and are either:

- an Australian citizen; or
- a permanent visa holder; or
- holders of a sub-class 300, 309, 444, 445, 461, 785, 790, or 820 visa; or
- secondary holders of a temporary visa of sub-class 188, 457, 482, 489, 491 or 494 visa; or
- holders of a Bridging Visa E (subclasses 050 and 051) where the visa holder has made a valid application for a visa of subclass 785 or 790; or
- Ukraine citizens who are holders of a visa subclass 449 or 786; or
- Afghan citizens who are holders of a visa sub-class 449; or
- Holders of a bridging visa who are eligible to work and who have made a valid application for a subclass 866.
